April In Meeting: Come out on April 11th to learn how to blend ciders with a **cider tasting** presented by [Bauman's Cider Company's](#) founder and head cider maker, Christine Walter. While the talk will focus on blending to create a finished cider, Christine wanted to encourage OBC members to ask questions about her specialty cider chemistry and yeast nutrition.

With the [2019 Portland International Cider Cup](#) judging on April 7th, it's a great time to learn more about cider production from last year's Gold Medal winning Dry Cider maker. Christine Walter, who has a degree in Biochemistry from Lewis & Clark University, started Bauman's Cider Company in 2016 on her family's 1895 homestead in Gervais, Oregon.

OBC to Pilot Great Western Malting's Beta Test Program for Experimental Malts

Great Western Malting (GWM) has reached out to the Oregon Brew Crew to have OBC members pilot their nation-wide experimental malt Beta Test Program. Great Western Malting will be at the **June In-Meeting** to introduce the Beta Test Program and distribute the first batch of experimental malt.

Currently, GWM is planning on beta testing 3 to 4 malts a year and distributing the malt to OBC members at club meetings through a GWM representative. OBC Members who brew with the experimental malt are expected to complete a digital survey in a timely manner with constructive feedback regarding their brewing results. Additionally, GWM requests, "Because the malt may or may not make it to final commercial production in the sampled form, any social media or public commentary about the product needs to specify that the sample was not necessarily indicative of a final commercial product."

Collaborative Brew Day with Little Beast Brewing

OBC member Rodney Kibzey is meeting with Charles Porter to finalize the recipe and brew day. More news coming soon. Thank you for your interest in this brew-tunity and for submitting a robust pool of recipe ideas.

Upcoming In-Meeting Education Topics

The June In Meeting Education Topic will be on Malt Steeping. Tyler Shoales, former Maltster with Canada Malting/Great Western Malting, current Malt Specialist with Country Malt Group, Great Western Malting and an avid homebrewer, will conduct a presentation on how to do, as he calls it, "hot steeps" to assess potential aroma, flavor, etc. when building a malt bill for a recipe. Thanks to all the OBC members who requested this topic.

As for other In Meetings, to round out our series on the four main ingredients in beer, Imperial Yeast will be coming in late summer and tentatively we have scheduled Green Dragon Brewing's Steve Carper to explain the basics of water adjustment.

Events Corner

Events Coordination Chair – Michele Lish

Please mark your calendar for some upcoming events where OBC needs your help as a volunteer and in return you get karma points, often free beer and other swag, and OBC gets funds from the event.

The first event is the Nano Beer Fest. This is held at John's Market in the Multnomah Village neighborhood of Portland - 3535 SW Multnomah Blvd. The Festival is **Fri, Apr 26 at 2pm - Sun, Apr 28 at 5pm**. OBC members have their pick of all shifts on Saturday and Sunday, and we will need 20 – 30 volunteers. Nano Beer Fest feature 50+ beers, ciders and mead made by some of the most inventive and newest members of the local craft industry. For our hard work, **they are donating \$500 to OBC**. Volunteers each receive free entry, a fest shirt, and drink tokens which may be used only the day before your shift or after your shift is complete unless it is the last shift of the day. So if you work on Sunday, come in on Friday or Saturday to get your tokens and drinking cup. OLCC rules say you can't drink before pouring beer or drink while pouring beer, so drink at another time and always drink responsibly. If you work two shifts, you get double tickets. Nano Fest is a great opportunity to hang out with nano brewers themselves since they like to tell attendees about their beers and will often pour. It also helps OBC -- we get a portion of proceeds (10% this year) from the festival in return for our volunteer efforts. No OLCC permit is required, anyone can volunteer if they are 21 or older!

What All Members Need to Know About Prizes and Raffles

You can win some pretty darn nice raffle prizes at OBC events, even something as awesome as a brew kettle from Spike Brewing, a book on brewing, 50 lbs. of grain, gift certificates, and much more! We generally have a raffle at our bigger events and at competitions hosted by OBC. During our competitions we sell raffle tickets, but you also are given a ticket for volunteering and can earn many tickets all year long. You get free raffle tickets by earning points throughout the year whenever you volunteer to help, and there are a lot of opportunities for volunteering. These are called Member of the Year (MOY) points. These points earn

tickets which are given to you when you come to the Holiday Party that is held every December. Here are a few ways to earn those tickets:

- Judge/Staff/Steward at certain competitions
- Assist at meetings – several ways to get points
- Bring food and beer to meetings
- Pour beer at certain events, or staff our OBC booth at them – Nano Beer Fest is coming up soon, so please sign up for that <https://oregonbrewcrew.org/event-3322684>
- Write an article for this newsletter
- Serve on an OBC committee – contact Eric now as he is looking for help with the next OBC sponsored competition, Heart of Cascadia <https://oregonbrewcrew.org/heart-of-cascadia>
- Teach, do a demo, or conduct an experiment
- Brew beer at certain events. The **Big Brew Day** (see below for announcement) is coming up soon. Contact Brian Haslip at brian.haslip@oregonbrewcrew.org

You also enter your points at that link. Some people call these karma points, and I know more of you have earned them than are noted on the website, so please enter them now. I know we had people bring food for both the Jan and Mar in meetings, and we had some volunteers for SheBrew and we had others help at our meetings, so please enter those points. We prefer that you enter them as you earn them, but you can do that any time **until the deadline of Nov 30th.**

If you enter competitions that are designated as OSHBOTY and win as follows: Points will be awarded for competitors that win individual categories and overall Best of Show (BOS), and 2nd and 3rd BOS, then everyone who earned points gets raffle tickets at the Holiday Party. If you are on the OBC board, you can't earn MOY points for your participation, and the board is expected to participate a lot, but they too get tickets for the Holiday party raffle.

The final way to get points is to enter competitions and have your beer selected for win/place/show. This is then recorded in another OBC award

called the OBC Homebrewer's Cup Competition. The Homebrewer's Cup is intended to recognize participation and achievements in homebrewing competitions. Again OBC gives free tickets, when you come to the Holiday Party, to those who are on this list. <https://oregonbrewcrew.org/obccup> Now that you know how to earn points, start volunteering and then go to the OBC website and record them for MOY. This can be found under "competitions" > "for Member" > "Member of the Yea."


7th Annual Heart of Cascadia now Open!



Don't forget the OBC Pilot System!

Fabulous upgrades to the Pilot System!

Last year, we decided to spend the full pilot system budget on much needed upgrades and improvements. A Brobdingnagian thank you to Brian Haslip for ordering the parts and assembling/transfiguring the system! Great job!

Some of the improvements include:

- Added a 2nd, better pump on a new stand
- Improved the existing pump
- Added switches to both pumps
- Replaced all of the hoses
- Added a sparge arm
- Replaced the thermometers with a digital one
- Added a 3rd burner high BTU (Blichmann stand donated by Jim Thompson), that thing is a massive improvement!

Future improvements will include:

- Replacing the other burners with high BTU
- Etching of the interior of the keggles
- Possible new keggles to expand the system
- Others? Your suggestions requested!

In addition to the amazing upgrades and improvements, we are also improving the sign-out process.

There are new forms to complete that will allow you to request specific parts instead of the entire thing. This will enable multiple members to utilize the system simultaneously. Look for the new sign-out form online in 2019 to reflect these changes. Reserve here:
